GREETINGS

The 21st Century COE Program has been promoted by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology since 2002 in order to provide prioritized assistance for formation of global research and education centers by introducing the principle of competition and create internationally competitive universities of the highest quality in the world.
