

of necessary prefatory remarks.

Let the reader of these letters to be persuaded, that all the terms & phrases in this correspondence, which may appear to him too strong or inappropriate are not at all owing to any rashness or impetuosity, but to a conviction - perhaps an erroneous one - that if any thing at all is to be hoped from despatching to a Japanese Government they must expect very shortly the loss of their miniature Government in particular cannot plainly be given to understand, they are known for what they really are, & not taken by us for what they would pass themselves off. Let any western Government declare & obtain the most perfect conciliation from Japan by pure diplomacy alone, let I declare myself quite ready to lay hands from the Zouhoosan managing for any time in my letters, they might choose to declare as offensive to his ^{most} impetuosity.

(They afterward offered apologetics on the wording of this plea, having intended
only to say, the people frightened by the running to 2 or 3 of my 2 dogs, had
summoned to drive them back with stones (S. Letters. 29.30.) but
I insisted on their plain confession of guilt.
