Left home at 13 supported self as tutor. Very brilliant
 student - graduated from medicine at Padua, Italy, in 1836.
 made a special study of cholera, became an authority on it.
 obtained great honor and wealth through his success in the
 treatment of the great epidemic at Naples, etc. went to Egypt - made
 head surgeon of a man of war in service of Mohamed
 Ali. Served as surgeon for Turkish government.
 was stationed near Smyrna. went to England determined
 to preach Christ. married Elizabeth near Barwick
 an Englishwoman. In 1846 sent by Buttelheim
 as first Christian missionary to Japan worked
 4 years in Fuchū islands. Persecution, danger
 abuse but was a man of iron will & determined
 through his great medical skill. zeal as a preacher
 and his translation of most of Bible into Japanese
 he won his staff at last. After 9 years he came
 to America lecturing on his work in order to raise
 money to broaden its field. Had 1 son, two daughters
 all dead - 8 grandchildren only one of whom carried
 the name.

Dr. B. F. Buttelheim of Springfield, S.D.
 went to Japan in 1853 as surgeon and
 interpreter for Commodore Perry on U.S. Ship Plymouth
 spoke 36 languages and dialects. Affected men of
 great ability - sent to Hong Kong Chinese medical
 mission.
