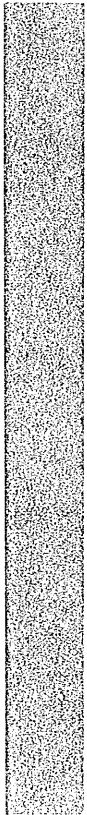

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TALKING PAPER

November 4, 1966

1. On October 18, 1966, the United States Government presented in the course of the Tenth Meeting of the Consultative Committee its formal proposals for the Japanese program of assistance to Okinawa in Japan Fiscal Year 1967. Subsequently, informal conversations were held between representatives of the Special Areas Liaison Bureau and the U.S. Civil Administration, culminating in the presentation to the USCAR representative on October 24, 1966, of an informal Government of Japan counter-proposal to the U.S. proposal of October 18. The Civil Administration has reviewed this document, and has the comments set forth below.

2. Comments on Individual Projects.

A. Projects Proposed for Reduction:

1. Teachers' salary (No. 1) \$7,733,200. No objection.
2. Children's playground (No. 17) \$108,000. No objection.
3. Old age welfare pension (No. 20) \$1,188,600. No objection.
4. Student health examination program (No. 32) \$45,050. No objection.

B. Projects Proposed for Increase:

1. Free textbooks (No. 5) \$598,156. No objection.
2. Facilities for University of Ryukyus (No. 8) \$552,222. There is no objection to including expenses for a survey of the matter of establishment of a medical school. However, the proposal for Japanese Government examination of medical practitioners in Okinawa should be discussed further.
3. Telephone circuit (No. 34) \$583,917. No objection.
4. Weather facilities (No. 43) \$382,467. No objection.
5. Weather supplies (No. 44) \$126,178. No objection.

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C. Proposed New Projects:

1. Trash disposal furnace, \$133,333. No objection.
 2. Aja port survey, \$52,081. No objection.
 3. Child welfare, \$263,889. No objection provided that the funds are fitted into a total aid level of \$25.8 million.
 4. Pasture grass improvement, \$34,458. No objection.
 5. Pineapple cold storage. It is desired that this project be deleted from the aid program in view of the question-ability of the economic feasibility of storing canned pineapple in refrigerated storage. The wide use of hormones to control the pineapple harvest period may negate the need for refrigerated storage. There is no objection to the Government of Japan dispatching technicians to evaluate the feasibility of the project.
 6. Marine resource survey, \$55,556. No objection.
 7. Model pastureland survey. The Government of the Ryukyu Islands desires to participate in the survey and to fund the necessary equipment and supplies. There is no objection to the Government of Japan dispatching technicians.
 8. Cultural exchange of scientists, \$4,167. No objection.
 9. Okinawa students cultural center, \$30,889. No objection.
 10. Miyagibaru rehabilitation center, \$55,555. No objection.
3. With the exception of the child welfare project (\$263,889), the proposed additions and reductions approximately balance out. The Civil Administration of the Ryukyu Islands prefers that no changes be made to the Government of Japan aid program which would result in any increase above the \$25.8 million level. However, there is no objection if the Government of Japan desires to re-program within the US-proposed aid level - for example, in order to accommodate the child welfare project.
