



- 昭和42会計年度(昭和42年4月1日から昭和43年3月31日まで)における琉球諸島に対する援助のため、日本国政府援助計画としてこの覚書の付表の昭和42会計年度計画分に掲げるとおり日本国政府歳出予算が成立したので、日本国政府はこの目的に充てられた資金を日本国の関係法令に従つて支出する意向であり、琉球政府はこの援助計画に同意する意思を有することについて、日本国政府総理府と琉球諸島米国民政府を通じての琉球政府との間において了解が成立した。

TALKING PAPER

CONCERNING PURCHASE OF ARTICLES

In purchasing articles required for the projects undertaken with the Japanese aid funds, where the price and quality of Ryukyuan and Japanese goods are competitive with those of other countries, priority will be given to the Japanese and Ryukyuan goods.

TALKING PAPER

CONCERNING PARAGRAPH 14

Paragraph 14 (utilization of equipment for purposes intended) is understood to mean that with respect to the equipment and facilities procured with the aid funds, the Ryukyu Government will refrain from any acts, such as transfer or lease to others, exchange or mortgage unless there exist good reasons therefor.

It is desirable that scholarship funds be made available for loans to students in universities and senior high schools in the Ryukyus whose scholastic records are excellent but who have, for economic reasons, experienced difficulty in pursuing their studies, and that the scholarship funds be administered by the Ryukyu Scholarship Society through the Government of the Ryukyu Islands and earmarked in the following categories:

It is further desirable that, in principle, the amount of monthly loan be 3,000 yen for senior high school students, 5,000 yen for university students commuting to school from home, and 8,000 yen for university students commuting to school from places other than their homes; and the repayment of these scholarship loans be in the amount of 1,500 yen per month for students in senior high school and 3,000 yen per

month

month for university students for a period equivalent to the time during which the loan was obtained, and if the loan is repaid under an annual installment plan within 20 years after the completion of their studies the remainder of the loan shall be waived.

MEMORANDUM CONCERNING AID FUNDS
FOR THE RYUKYU ISLANDS FOR JFY 1967
(DRAFT)

1. (Purpose)

For the purpose of providing assistance to promote the welfare and well-being of the inhabitants of the Ryukyu Islands and their economic development, the Prime Minister's Office of the Government of Japan (hereinafter referred to as the Prime Minister's Office) will provide the Government of the Ryukyu Islands (hereinafter referred to as the Ryukyu Government), through the United States Civil Administration of the Ryukyu Islands (hereinafter referred to as the United States Civil Administration) with grant-in-aid funds to the extent of an amount totalling ¥6,744,457,000 for the Japanese fiscal year of 1967 (1 April 1967 through 31 March 1968) according to the break-down specified in the Annex attached and made a part hereof.

The amount within the limit of the sum allocated to JFY 1968 Aid Program (from 1 April 1968 to 31 March 1969) described in the Annex will be provided from the Prime Minister's Office to the Government of the Ryukyu Islands from 1 April to 30 June 1968, as principle, subject to the approval by Diet of GOJ estimated budget for JFY 1968 in relation to this amount.

2.

2. (Definition of Terms)

In this memorandum, the terms listed below will be interpreted as specified in the following:

- a. Project - Item of aid funds as described in the Annex.
- b. Subproject - Detailed sub-item of each project which is to be in principle a unit for each contract made by the Ryukyu Government.

3. (Type of Currencies)

Aid funds will be provided through being credited to the non-resident free yen account of the Ryukyu Government by the Government of Japan.

4. (Execution Plan)

The Ryukyu Government will prepare the execution plan before seeking the prior concurrence of the Prime Minister's Office in the project plan, and will submit it to the Prime Minister's Office through the United States Civil Administration.

The execution plan will contain the statement, according to project and subproject titles, with such details as total project cost as against the total amount indicated in the Annex, division of fiscal year, source of funds, plan for request of funds, scheduled date of initiation and completion, and other matters necessary for the prior concurrence in the project plan and preparation for disbursement of aid funds by the Prime Minister's Office.

5.

5. (Project Plan)

The Ryukyu Government will work out the project plan as against total amount indicated in the Annex, in accordance with subproject title, in case of execution of any project described in the project plan and will seek the prior concurrence of the Prime Minister's Office therein through the United States Civil Administration.

The project plan will contain the statement with such details as location, purpose and description, estimated cost, scheduled dates for initiation and completion and other necessary matters.

5-2 When the Prime Minister's Office is sought for prior concurrence according to the above-mentioned provision, it will give its concurrence only to the project plan based on the JFY 1967 amount indicated in the Annex.

When the project plan has been concurred in by the Prime Minister's Office, the Ryukyu Government will proceed to execute it.

6. (Transfer of Aid Funds)

The aid funds will be turned over to the Ryukyu Government after a report is sent to the Prime Minister's Office on the satisfactory completion of the project based on the concurred project plan in accordance with above-mentioned paragraph as referred to in paragraph 11 below. However, Gaisan-barai may be made in advance.

7.

7. (Carry-over of Aid Funds)

The aid funds for JFY 1967 program in the Annex will, in principle, be expended by the Ryukyu Government during the Japanese fiscal year of 1967. However, with regard to the aid funds which have not been expended during the Japanese fiscal year of 1967, necessary action will be initiated under related laws and regulations in Japan, so that these funds may be expended during the fiscal year of 1968.

8. (Conditions of Granting Aid Funds)

The aid funds will be used in accordance with the project plan concurred in by the Prime Minister's Office, as provided for in paragraph 5² above.

Should a change become necessary in the project plan concurred in by the Prime Minister's Office under paragraph 5², the Ryukyu Government shall seek advance concurrence therein of the Prime Minister's Office in the same manner as stipulated in paragraph 5. However, in case that the change is of minor nature, no advance concurrence will be necessary.

9. (Report on Progress)

The Ryukyu Government will submit to the United States Civil Administration a quarterly report on the progress of the aid program funded by the Prime Minister's Office. Said report will be transmitted to the Prime Minister's Office through the United States Civil Administration.

10.

10. Misuse of Aid Funds)

In the event that the aid funds are not used in accordance with the purposes intended or in violation of the terms and conditions of the present Memorandum, the Prime Minister's Office may advise the Ryukyu Government through the United States Civil Administration to rectify any misuse of the funds or demand the repayment by the Ryukyu Government of a part or the whole of the aid funds.

10-2 In the event that the Ryukyu Government is advised to rectify any misuse of the funds or demanded the repayment of a part or the whole of the aid funds, according to the above-mentioned provision, it must take the proper measures for rectification or repayment.

11. (Report on Completion)

When each project based on the concurred project plan, according to the provision of Paragraph 5-2 is fully completed, the Ryukyu Government will submit to the United States Civil Administration a report on completion of the project. Said report will be transmitted to the Prime Minister's Office. The Audit Report on the project, by the Board of Audit of the Ryukyu Government, will be submitted in the same manner as early thereafter as practicable.

12. (Audit)

The Prime Minister's Office may dispatch officials to verify completion of projects financed under the terms of this Memorandum and proper expenditure of aid funds.

The

The officials will be dispatched under such conditions as may be agreed upon by the Prime Minister's Office and United States Civil Administration, after submission to the Prime Minister's Office of report on completion of some or all of the project plan.

13. (Utilization of Equipment for Purposes Intended)

The equipment and facilities procured with the aid funds will be utilized to fulfill the purposes foreseen in the project which has been submitted by the Ryukyu Government.

14. (Amendment to Memorandum)

Should an amendment to the provisions of the present Memorandum become necessary, it will be decided on by agreement among the Prime Minister's Office, the United States Civil Administration and the Ryukyu Government.

In case the Prime Minister's Office concurs in any of the project plans submitted in accordance with paragraph 5-2, above, in such a manner as to cause alteration in the item, amount or description in the Annex, the Annex will be regarded as modified by such concurrence accordingly.

The same principle will apply in case a change is made to any of the project plans in accordance with paragraph 8, above.

15.

15. (Validity of Memorandum)

This Memorandum will enter into force from the day on which the Ryukyu Government has obtained the approval of the United States Civil Administration thereon.

I refer to your letter of September 14, 1967 to Mr. Lewis M. Purnell which transmitted the Japanese drafts of the "Memorandum Concerning Aid Funds for the Ryukyu Islands for JFY 1967 with Annex and Talking Papers" and the "Explanatory Notes on the Memorandum for JFY 1967 in comparison with that of JFY 1966". The United States Civil Administration of the Ryukyu Islands has examined the drafts and proposes that a number of minor revisions be made primarily for reasons of clarity. The proposed changes and their supporting rationale as well as annotated copies of the draft documents are enclosed for perusal by the Government of Japan. Representatives of the Government of the Ryukyu Islands concur in the proposed revisions.

If the Government of Japan agrees to the revised English texts, the Japanese texts should be similarly revised and the resulting documents (signed by an official of the Japanese Government) forwarded to the Embassy for transmittal to and signature by the United States Civil Administration of the Ryukyu Islands and the Government of the Ryukyu Islands.

In accordance with a rearrangement of responsibilities within the Embassy, further correspondence on this subject should be addressed to the Counselor for Economic Affairs.

I refer to your letter of October 26, 1967, which furnished to the Embassy for transmittal to the United States Civil Administration of the Ryukyu Islands copies of the draft "Memorandum Concerning Items and Costs of Aid Projects of the Government of Japan to the Ryukyu Islands JFY 1967." The United States Civil Administration and the Government of the Ryukyu Islands have reviewed the draft and propose the following revisions:

a. English Text of the Annex: Revise Item No. 44 entitled "Meteorological Observation" (page 6) to read Item 45 "Weather Station Equipment and Supplies".

b. Japanese Text of the Annex: Revise Item No. 45 to read Item 44.

c. Japanese Text of the Annex: Revise Item No. 44 (penultimate page) entitled "高層気象観測業務" to read Item 45 entitled "高層気象台備品及び消耗品".

If these changes are acceptable to the Government of Japan, I suggest that the agreed text be prepared for signature by representatives of the Government of Japan, the Government of the Ryukyu Islands and the United States Civil Administration of the Ryukyu Islands.

MEMORANDUM CONCERNING ITEMS AND COSTS OF AID
PROJECTS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN TO THE RYUKYU ISLANDS
FOR THE JAPANESE FISCAL YEAR OF 1967

An understanding has been reached between the Prime Minister's Office, Government of Japan and the Government of the Ryukyu Islands through the United States Civil Administration of the Ryukyu Islands that since the budgetary appropriations of the Government of Japan have been established for its assistance to the Ryukyu Islands in the Japanese Fiscal Year of 1967 (April 1967 through March 1968) as listed in the annex under this Memorandum as the amount for the Japanese Government's Aid Program in the Fiscal Year of 1967, the Government of Japan will disburse the funds appropriated for this purpose in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations of Japan, and that the Government of the Ryukyu Islands will agree with such an assistance program.

An understanding has been also reached that the amount for the Japanese Government's Aid Program in the Fiscal Year of 1968 listed in the annex is expected to be provided by the Government of Japan to the Government of the Ryukyu Islands from 1 April 1968 to 30 June of the same year, in principle, on condition that the Japanese Government's budgetary appropriations of this amount for the Fiscal Year of 1968 is established.

MEMORANDUM CONCERNING AID FUNDS
FOR THE RYUKYU ISLANDS FOR JFY 1967

1. (Purpose)

For the purpose of providing assistance to promote the welfare and well-being of the inhabitants of the Ryukyu Islands and their economic development, the Prime Minister's Office of the Government of Japan (hereinafter referred to as the Prime Minister's Office) will provide the Government of the Ryukyu Islands (hereinafter referred to as the Ryukyu Government), through the United States Civil Administration of the Ryukyu Islands (hereinafter referred to as the United States Civil Administration) with grant-in-aid funds to the extent of an amount totalling ¥6,744,457,000 for the Japanese fiscal year of 1967 (1 April 1967 through 31 March 1968) according to the break-down specified in the Annex attached and made a part hereof.

The amount within the limit of the sum allocated to the JFY 1968 Aid Program (from 1 April 1968 to 31 March 1969) described in the Annex will be provided from the Prime Minister's Office to the Ryukyu Government from 1 April to 30 June 1968, in principle, subject to the approval by the Diet of the GOJ estimated budget for JFY 1968.

2.

2. (Definition of Terms)

In this memorandum, the terms listed below will be interpreted as specified in the following:

- a. Project - Item of aid funds as described in the Annex.
- b. Subproject - Detailed sub-item of each project which is to be in principle a unit for each contract made by the Ryukyu Government.
- c. Gaisan-barai - Payment in part or in full of the aid funds for each project before completion of the project concerned.

3. (Type of Currencies)

Aid funds will be provided through being credited to the non-resident free yen account of the Ryukyu Government by the Government of Japan.

4. (Execution Plan)

The Ryukyu Government will prepare the execution plan before seeking the prior concurrence of the Prime Minister's Office in the project plan, and will submit it to the Prime Minister's Office through the United States Civil Administration.

The execution plan will contain, for each project and subproject, such details as total project cost as against the total

total amount indicated in the Annex, division of fiscal year, source of funds, plan for request of funds, scheduled date of initiation and completion, and other matters necessary for the prior concurrence in the project plan and preparation for disbursement of aid funds by the Prime Minister's Office.

5. (Project Plan)

When the Ryukyu Government wishes to execute any project described in the execution plan, it will prepare project plans with subproject details as against the total amount indicated in the Annex and will seek the prior concurrence of the Prime Minister's Office therein through the United States Civil Administration.

The project plan will contain such details as location, purpose and description, estimated cost, scheduled dates of initiation and completion and other necessary matters.

6. The prior concurrence of the Prime Minister's Office on project plans submitted in accordance with the above-mentioned provision will apply only to projects in the JFY 1967 program indicated in the Annex.

When the project plan has been concurred in by the Prime Minister's Office, the Ryukyu Government will proceed to execute it.

7.

7. (Transfer of Aid Funds)

The aid funds will be turned over to the Ryukyu Government after a report on satisfactory completion of the concurred project is sent to the Prime Minister's Office in compliance with paragraph 13, below. However, Gaisan-barai may be made in advance (for projects in the JFY 1967 program).

8. (Carry-over of Aid Funds)

The aid funds for the JFY 1967 program in the Annex will, in principle, be expended by the Ryukyu Government during the Japanese fiscal year of 1967. However, with regard to the aid funds which have not been expended during the Japanese fiscal year of 1967, necessary action will be initiated under related laws and regulations in Japan, so that these funds may be expended during the fiscal year of 1968.

9. (Conditions of Granting Aid Funds)

The aid funds will be used in accordance with the project plan concurred in by the Prime Minister's Office, as provided for in paragraph 6 above.

Should a change become necessary in the project plan concurred in by the Prime Minister's Office under paragraph 6, the Ryukyu Government shall seek advance concurrence therein of the Prime Minister's Office in the same manner as stipulated in paragraph 5. However, in case that the change is of minor nature, no advance concurrence will be necessary.

10.

10. (Report on Progress)

The Ryukyu Government will submit to the United States Civil Administration a quarterly report on the progress of the aid program funded by the Prime Minister's Office. Said report will be transmitted to the Prime Minister's Office through the United States Civil Administration.

11. (Misuse of Aid Funds)

In the event that the aid funds are not used in accordance with the purposes intended or are used in violation of the terms and conditions of the present Memorandum, the Prime Minister's Office may advise the Ryukyu Government through the United States Civil Administration to rectify any misuse of the funds or demand the repayment by the Ryukyu Government of a part or the whole of the aid funds.

12. The Ryukyu Government will take appropriate measures in the event that it is advised to rectify any misuse of the funds or is requested to repay a part or the whole of the aid funds, in accordance with the above-mentioned provision.

13. (Report on Completion)

When each project for which a project plan has been concurred in under the provision of Paragraph 6 is fully completed, the Ryukyu Government will submit to the United States Civil Administration a report on completion of the project. Said report will be transmitted to the Prime Minister's Office.

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The Audit Report on the project, by the Board of Audit of the Ryukyu Government, will be submitted in the same manner as early thereafter as practicable.

14. (Audit)

The Prime Minister's Office may dispatch officials to verify completion of projects financed under the terms of this Memorandum and proper expenditure of aid funds.

The officials will be dispatched under such conditions as may be agreed upon by the Prime Minister's Office, the United States Civil Administration, and the Ryukyu Government, after submission to the Prime Minister's Office of report on completion of some or all of the project plans.

15. (Utilization of Equipment for Purposes Intended)

The equipment and facilities procured with the aid funds will be utilized to fulfill the purposes foreseen in the project which has been submitted by the Ryukyu Government.

16. (Amendment to Memorandum)

Should an amendment to the provisions of the present Memorandum become necessary, it will be decided on by agreement among the Prime Minister's Office, the United States Civil Administration and the Ryukyu Government.

In case the Prime Minister's Office concurs in any of the project plans submitted in accordance with paragraph 6, above,

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in such a manner as to cause alteration in the item, amount or description in the Annex, the Annex will be regarded as modified by such concurrence accordingly.

The same principle will apply in case a change is made to any of the project plans in accordance with paragraph 9, above.

17. (Validity of Memorandum)

This Memorandum will enter into force from the day on which the Ryukyu Government has obtained the approval of the United States Civil Administration thereon.

SUPPLEMENT

1. (Details of Implementation of Memorandum)

Details which may be deemed necessary for the implementation of this Memorandum will be determined by agreement of the Prime Minister's Office, the United States Civil Administration, and the Ryukyu Government.

2. (The Special Provision Concerning the Compensation for Public School Teachers of Compulsory Education)

The aid fund provided to the Ryukyu Government based on the "Memorandum Concerning the Aid Fund for Compensation for Public School Teachers of Compulsory Education for May and June, 1967 (31 July 1967)" is regarded as having been provided according to this Memorandum.

TALKING PAPER
CONCERNING AID FUND FOR SCHOLARSHIP
(Item No. 9)

It is desirable that scholarship funds be made available for loans to students in universities and senior high schools in the Ryukyus whose scholastic records are excellent but who have, for economic reasons, experienced difficulty in pursuing their studies, and that the scholarship funds be administered by the Ryukyu Scholarship Society through the Government of the Ryukyu Islands and earmarked in the following categories:

1. For university students (all grades)
- ¥38,000,000
2. For senior high school students (all grades) ..
- ¥27,000,000

It is further desirable that, in principle, the amount of monthly loan be 3,000 yen for senior high school students, 5,000 yen for university students commuting to school from home, and 8,000 yen for university students commuting to school from places other than their homes; and the repayment of these scholarship loans be in the amount of 1,500 yen per month for students in senior high school and 3,000 yen per

month

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month for university students for a period equivalent to the time during which the loan was obtained, and if the loan is repaid under an annual installment plan within 20 years after the completion of their studies the remainder of the loan shall be waived.

TALKING PAPER
CONCERNING PURCHASE OF ARTICLES

In purchasing articles required for the projects undertaken with the Japanese aid funds, where the price and quality of Ryukyuan and Japanese goods are competitive with those of other countries, priority will be given to the Japanese and Ryukyuan goods.

TALKING PAPER
CONCERNING PARAGRAPH 15

Paragraph 15 (utilization of equipment for purposes intended) is understood to mean that with respect to the equipment and facilities procured with the aid funds, the Ryukyu Government will refrain from any acts, such as transfer or lease to others, exchange or mortgage unless there exist good reasons therefor.

○ なお、付表の昭和43会計年度（昭和43年4月1日から昭和44年3月31日まで）計画分の範囲内の金額は、その金額について日本国政府歳出予算が成立することを条件として、原則として昭和43年4月1日から同年6月30日までの間において、総理府から琉球政府に供与されることが予定される。

(定義)

○ この覚書において、次の各号に掲げる用語の意義は、それぞれ当該各号に定めるところによる。

- a 事業項目 付表に定める援助金の各項目をいう。
- b 事業細目 事業項目の細分で原則として琉球政府が契約の単位とするものをいう。

c 概算払 事業項目の事業のすべてが完了する前に、当該事業項目の援助金の一部又は全部を支払う支払方法をいう。

(通貨の種類)

○ 3 援助金は、日本国政府が琉球政府の非居住者自由円勘定に貸記する方法により供与する。

(実行計画)

○ 4 琉球政府は、総理府に対する事業計画の事前同意を求める前に、実行計画を作成し、米国民政府を通じて総理府に送付するものとする。

○ 実行計画には事業項目及び事業細目ごとに、付表の総額に係る総事業費及びその年度区分、負担区分、援助金の請求計画、着手予定年月日及び完了予定年月日並びに総理府が事業計画に対する事前同意及び援助金の支払に必要な準備を行なうために必要なその他の事項を記載するものとする。

(事業計画)

○ 5 琉球政府は、実行計画に記載した事業を実施しようとするときは、事業細目ごとに付表の総額に係る事業計画を作成し、同事業計画に対し、米国民政府を通じ総理府の事前同意を求めるものとする。

○ 事業計画には、場所、目的及び内容、見積価格、着手及び完

了の予定年月日その他必要な事項を記載するものとする。

6 総理府が前項の規定により事前同意を求められた場合は、付表の昭和42会計年度計画分の金額に係る事業計画に対してのみ同意するものとする。

琉球政府は、事業計画が総理府によって同意された後に同事業計画を実施に移すものとする。

(援助金の交付)

7 援助金は、前項の規定により同意された事業計画に基づく事業が満足に完了した旨の第13項の完了報告書が総理府に送付された後に、琉球政府に対して交付されるものとする。ただし概算払を行なうことができる。

(援助金の繰越)

8 付表の昭和42会計年度計画分の金額に係る援助金は、原則として琉球政府により昭和42会計年度内において使用されるものとする。ただし、昭和42会計年度内に使用されなかつた援助金については、これらの援助金が昭和43会計年度中に使用されることができるよう、日本国との関係法令に基づいて必要措置がとられるものとする。

(交付の条件)

9 援助金は、第6項に基づいて総理府の同意を得た事業計画に従つて使用されなければならない。

第6項に基づいて総理府の同意を得た事業計画に変更の必要が生じた場合は、琉球政府は、第5項に定めるのと同様の方法によつて総理府の事前同意を求めるなければならない。ただし、その変更が軽微な変更である場合はこの限りではない。

(進捗状況の報告)

10 琉球政府は、総理府によって資金を交付される援助事業の進捗状況について、四半期報告書を米国民政府に提出するものとする。

同報告書は、米国民政府を通じて総理府に送付されるものとする。

(援助金の誤用)

11 援助金が、事業の本来の目的に従つて使用されていない場合又はこの覚書の条件に違反して使用された場合は、総理府は、米国民政府を通じて琉球政府に対し、その誤用の是正を勧告し又は援助金の一部若しくは全部の返還を求めることができる。

12 琉球政府は、前項の規定により、援助金の誤用について是正の勧告を受け、又は援助金の一部若しくは全部について返還を求められた場合には、是正又は返還の措置をとらなければならぬ。

(事業完了の報告)

13 琉球政府は、第6項の規定により同意された事業計画に基づ

く事業の全部が完了したときは、その完了報告書を米国民政府に提出するものとする。

同報告書は、総理府に転送されるものとする。

琉球政府の会計検査院による事業の検査報告書は、同様の方

法により、爾後可及的すみやかに提出されるものとする。

(会計検査)

- 14 総理府は、この覚書の条件に基づいて資金を交付した事業の完了及び援助金の適正な支出を確認するため、職員を派遣することができる。

同職員は、総理府、米国民政府及び琉球政府によつて同意された条件に従つて、一部又はすべての事業計画についての完了報告書が総理府に送付された後に派遣されるものとする。

(意図された目的のための器材の使用)

- 15 援助金によつて調達される器材及び施設は、琉球政府から提出されている計画に掲げられた目的を果すために使用されるものとする。

(覚書の修正)

- 16 この覚書の規定に修正の必要が生じたときは、総理府、米国民政府及び琉球政府の合意によつてその修正を決定するものとする。

第6項に基づき、総理府が付表に掲げる項目、金額及び事業

要目に異動を生じる結果となる事業計画に同意したときは、同意した事業計画に対応するように付表の修正が行なわれたものとみなす。第8項に基づき、事業計画の変更が行なわれた場合も同様とする。

(覚書の効力)

- 17 この覚書は、琉球政府がこれについて米国民政府の承認を得た日から効力を発する。

附 則

(覚書実施上の細目)

- 1 この覚書の実施のために必要と認められる細目については、総理府、米国民政府及び琉球政府の合意により決定されるものとする。

(公立義務教育諸学校教職員給与に関する特例)

- 2 「昭和42年5月及び6月分の公立義務教育諸学校教職員給与費に対する援助金に関する覚書(昭和42年7月31日)」に基づいて琉球政府に対して供された援助金は、この覚書に基づいて供与されたものとみなす。
