III. MEMORANDA

Memorandum No. 1

**Arrival Ceremonial  
at Tokyo International Airport**

(For fine weather)

Dress: Dark Suit

**May 12, 1972**

6:00 p.m. His Excellency the Vice President of the United States of America will arrive at Tokyo International Airport by a special plane.

The Head of the Suite of Honour and His Excellency the Ambassador of the United States of America in Japan will enter the plane for greeting.

H.E. the Vice President will descend from the plane followed by the Head of the Suite of Honour and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States, and will proceed toward Prime Minister Sato. Through the introduction of the Head of the Suite of Honour, the Prime Minister will greet H.E. the Vice President.

(In the meantime senior members of the Suite, coming down the stairway, will remain standing on it until the National Anthems of both countries will have been

played. Other members of the Suite will alight from the plane through the rear door and will get into their designated car and will remain there until departure from the Airport.)

At this time, there will be a flourish for about 7 seconds, and H.E. the Vice President and the Prime Minister, the former on the right and the latter on the left, will face the Guard of Honour obliquely and be ready for the National Anthems.

After the flourish, a 19 gun salute will be fired, and simultaneously, the National Anthems of both countries will be played.

H.E. the Vice President will be conducted by the Head of the Suite of Honour and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States, who are preceded by the Chief Administrator of the Airport, to the line formed by the welcoming dignitaries.

The Head of the Suite of Honour will first present Ambassador H. Takeuchi, Chief of Protocol. The Chief of Protocol will then present the dignitaries and the members of Diplomatic Corps present, and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States will present members of the Embassy and prominent

residents of his country in Japan.

Senior members of the Suite will follow H.E. the Vice President and exchange greeting with the members of the welcoming party.

(While the presentation is being made, Prime Minister Sato will be walking on the right side of H.E. the Vice President.)

After the presentation is over, H.E. the Vice President, in order to receive the salute of the Guard of Honour and inspect it, will proceed to the reviewing platform together with the Prime Minister, ushered by the Chief Administrator of the Airport and conducted by the Head of the Suite of Honour. H.E. the Ambassador of the United States and Lieutenant Colonel Garland will follow.

The senior members of the Suite will remain standing at the end of the receiving line.

H.E. the Vice President and Prime Minister Sato will mount the platform, the former on the right and the latter on the left facing the Guard of Honour. The Chief Administrator of the Airport, H.E. the Ambassador of the United States, the Head



of the Suite of Honour and Lieutenant Colonel Garland will, in that order from right to left, stand behind the platform.

H.E. the Vice President will receive the salute, which consists of the presenting of arms and the playing of ruffles and flourishes. Upon report of the Commander of the Guard of Honour, H.E. the Vice President will descend from the platform to start inspection with the Prime Minister. Lieutenant Colonel Garland will follow.

While inspecting the Guard of Honour, the Prime Minister will walk on the right side of H.E. the Vice President, who will be conducted by the Commander of the Guard of Honour.

At the middle of the line of the Guard of Honour, there will be the national flags of the United States of America and Japan, the former on the left and the latter on the right as seen from the platform. H.E. the Vice President will indicate his respect for the flags when passing them.

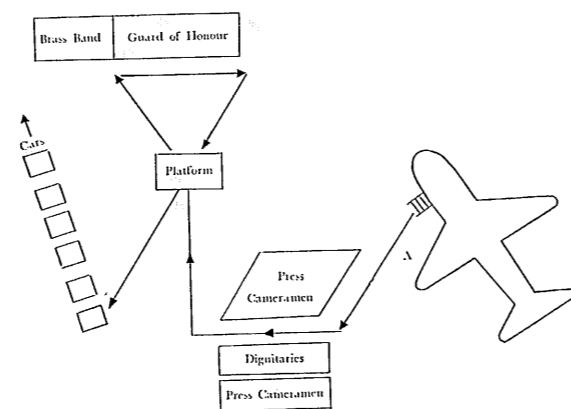
After returning to the platform with the Prime Minister, H.E. the Vice President will again receive the salute of the Guard of Honour.

Descending from the platform, H.E. the Vice President will proceed to the motorcade and will get into the first car with the Head of the Suite of Honour and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States. The senior members of the Suite will get into their designated cars.

6:20 p.m.

The motorcade will depart for Hotel Okura.

May 12, 1972  
6:00 p.m.

His Excellency the Vice President of the United States of America will arrive at Tokyo International Airport by a special plane.

The Head of the Suite of Honour and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States of America in Japan will enter the plane for greeting.

H.E. the Vice President will descend from the plane followed by the Head of the Suite of Honour and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States, and will get into the first car and proceed to the Special Guest Room in the finger of the terminal building.

Senior members of the Suite will follow by car.

(Other members of the Suite will alight from the plane through the rear door, get into the designated cars and will remain

there until departure from the Airport.)

In the Guest Room, H.E. the Vice President will first be greeted by Prime Minister Sato who is presented by the Head of the Suite of Honour.

At this time, there will be a flourish for about 7 seconds, and H.E. the Vice President and the Prime Minister, the former on the right and the latter on the left, will face the Guard of Honour Band and be ready for the National Anthems.

After the flourish, a 19 gun salute will be fired, and simultaneously, the National Anthems of both countries will be played.

H.E. the Vice President will be conducted by the Head of the Suite of Honour and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States to the line formed by the welcoming dignitaries.

(In the meantime, Senior members of the Suite will alight from the cars and follow H.E. the Vice President, while the rest will remain on the spot.)

The Head of the Suite of Honour will first present Ambassador H. Takeuchi, Chief of Protocol. The Chief of Protocol will then present the dignitaries and the members of

Diplomatic Corps present, and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States will present members of the Embassy and prominent residents of his country in Japan.

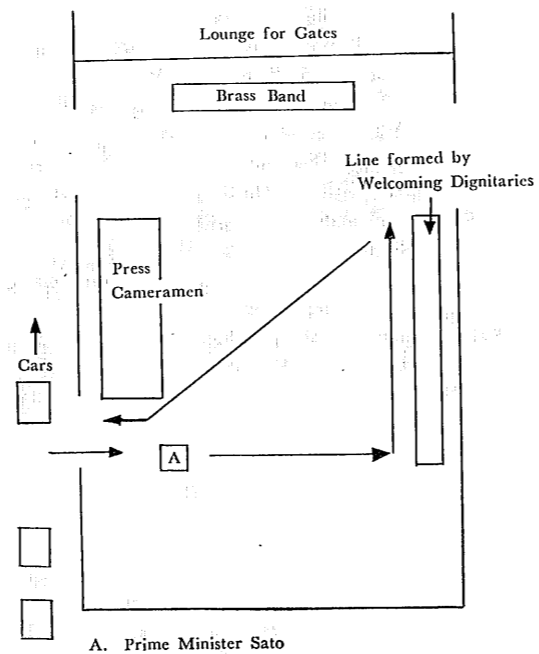
While the presentation is being made, the Prime Minister will be walking side by side with H.E. the Vice President.

After the presentation is over, H.E. the Vice President will proceed to the motorcade parked outside, and get into the first car with the Head of the Suite of Honour and H.E. the Ambassador of the United States.

**CIQ Formalities (arrival)**

The Customs, Immigration and Quarantine formalities will be completed by the Japanese officers concerned without delay.

As soon as the plane comes to a halt, a protocol officer will board the plane and get in touch with a protocol or baggage officer in the Suite to obtain passports, landing cards and certificates of vaccination of all the members of the Suite for necessary procedures.

The baggage of the party aboard will be unloaded, cleared through customs, and loaded onto a truck under the supervision of the protocol officer.

The truck will leave the Airport separately from the motorcade. Baggage of H.E. the Vice President will precede the motorcade and will be delivered to Hotel Okura, and the arrival of the rest of the baggage at the Hotel will be somewhat delayed.

Memorandum No. 3

**Imperial Audience and Court Luncheon**

Dress: Morning Coat

**May 13, 1972**

0:05 p.m. His Excellency the Vice President will leave Hotel Okura, accompanied by the Head of the Suite of Honour and followed by the invited members of the Suite as well as the members of the Suite of Honour.

0:15 p.m. H.E. the Vice President will arrive at the Imperial Palace.

At the main entrance, H.E. the Vice President will be greeted by the Grand Master of the Ceremonies who will conduct him to the Takenoma Room. H.E. the Ambassador of the United States will follow, and enter the Takenoma Room.

(Other members of the Suite will be ushered into the Rensui Room by a Master of the Ceremonies directly from the main entrance.)

In the Takenoma Room, His Majesty the Emperor will greet H.E. the Vice President, and together will take their seats for conversation.

At an appropriate moment photographs

of H.E. the Vice President with H.M. the Emperor will be taken.

His Imperial Highness the Crown Prince and His Imperial Highness the Prince will enter the Takenoma Room.

H.M. the Emperor will introduce T.I.H. the Princes to H.E. the Vice President.

Then H.M. the Emperor and H.E. the Vice President will be conducted to the Rensui Room by the Grand Master of the Ceremonies. T.I.H. the Princes, H.E. the Ambassador of the United States and the Grand Chamberlain will follow.

In the Rensui Room H.E. the Vice President will first introduce the members of the Suite to H.M. the Emperor.

Then other invited guests gathered in the Room will be presented to H.E. the Vice President.

Aperitif will be served.

H.M. the Emperor and H.E. the Vice President will enter the Homeiden (State Banquet Hall).

T.I.H. the Princes, the members of the Suite and other guests will follow.

Luncheon will be served, and music played.

(There will be no speech.)

After the luncheon H.M. the Emperor and H.E. the Vice President will enter the Shakkyonoma Room, followed by T.I.H. the Princes and other guests.

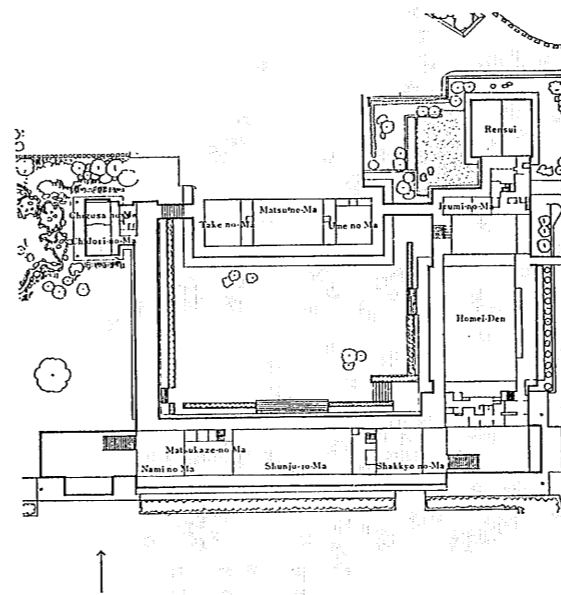
Drinks will be served.

H.E. the Vice President will take his leave of H.M. the Emperor and of T.I.H. the Princes.

The Grand Master of the Ceremonies will accompany H.E. the Vice President to the main entrance. The members of the Suites will follow.

7:25 p.m. His Excellency the Vice President of the United States of America, accompanied by the Head of the Suite of Honour and the invited members of the Suite will leave the Residence of the United States Ambassador for the Prime Minister's Official Residence.

7:30 p.m. H.E. the Vice President will arrive at the Official Residence. He will be welcomed by Prime Minister and Mrs. Sato at the main entrance and will be conducted to the small reception room. The members of the Suite will follow.

In the reception room, Prime Minister, Mrs. Sato and H.E. the Vice President will in that order form a receiving line. First, the members of the Suite will be received, and they will form a line next to the receiving line. Then, guests assembled in the larger reception room will come in and be presented one by one to H.E. the Vice President by the Chief of Protocol.

After the presentation is over, H.E. the



Vice President, together with Prime Minister and Mrs. Sato will move to the larger reception room and pose for press photographs.

Aperitif will be served.

Prime Minister and Mrs. Sato will conduct H.E. the Vice President to the banquet hall. The members of the Suite and all others will follow.

Dinner will be served, and music played.

When the dessert is served, Prime Minister will rise, deliver an address and then propose a toast.

H.E. the Vice President will rise, make a response and then propose a toast.

After the dinner, Prime Minister and Mrs. Sato will conduct H.E. the Vice President to the reception room. The members of the Suite and others will follow.

Coffee and liquor will be served.

When H.E. the Vice President takes his leave, Prime Minister and Mrs. Sato will escort him to the main entrance.

9:30 p.m. H.E. the Vice President will leave the Residence for Hotel Okura, accompanied by the Head of the Suite of Honour and followed by the members of the Suite.

A 19 gun salute will be fired and simul-  
taneously the National Anthems of both  
countries will be played.

H.E. the Vice President together with  
Prime Minister Sato, ushered by the Chief  
Administrator of the Airport and conducted

by the Head of the Suite of Honour, will proceed to the reviewing platform. H.E. the Ambassador of the United States and Lieutenant Colonel Garland will follow.

(Senior members of the Suite will stay behind, while other members of the Suite will board the plane through the rear door.)

H.E. the Vice President and Prime Minister Sato will mount the platform, the former on the right and the latter on the left facing the Guard of Honour. (There will be no inspection of the Guard of Honour.) The Chief Administrator of the Airport, H.E. the Ambassador of the United States, the Head of the Suite of Honour and Lieutenant Colonel Garland, in that order from right to left facing the Guard of Honour, will stand behind the platform.

After receiving the salute of the Guard of Honour, H.E. the Vice President together with the Prime Minister will descend from the platform.

H.E. the Vice President, conducted by the Chief Administrator of the Airport and the Head of the Suite of Honour, followed by H.E. the Ambassador of the United

States and Lieutenant Colonel Garland, will proceed to the line formed by the dignitaries and exchange greetings. Senior members of the Suite will follow.

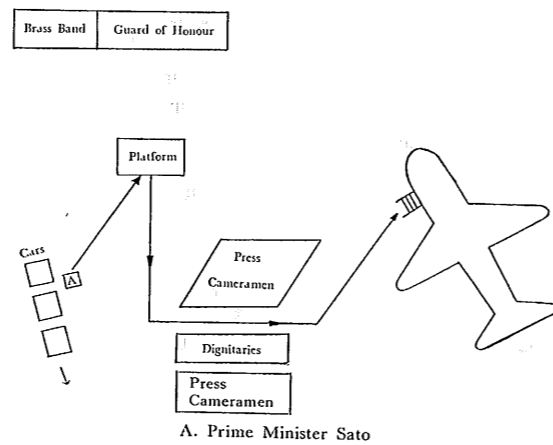

The senior members of the Suite will follow.

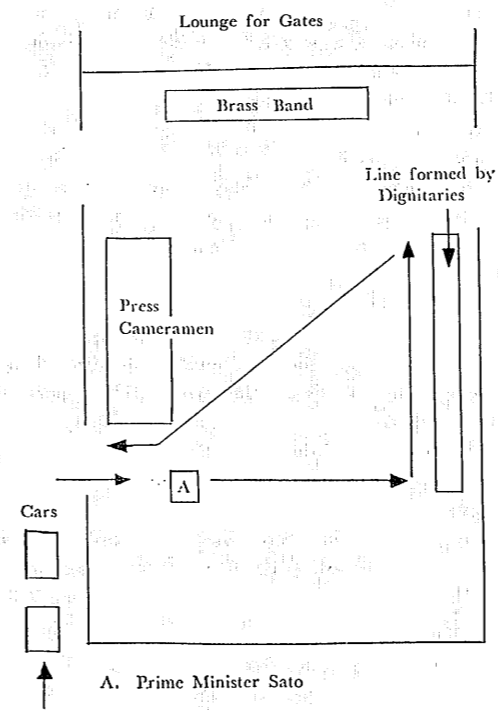

##### 1. Baggage

The members of the Suite are requested to have all pieces of their baggage ready outside the doors of their rooms by 7:00 a.m., May 16th for pick-up and delivery to Tokyo International Airport.
