

The Japanese Government's Financial Aid to Okinawa for Fiscal 1966 (Draft plan announced to the Press)

(November 2, 1965)

As a result of agreement being reached between Japan and the United States at the 8th meeting of the Japan-United States Consultative Committee held today, the Japanese Government's financial aid to Okinawa for fiscal 1966 has been informally decided upon. The Japanese Government's financial aid for Okinawa for the next fiscal year will be formally established when the contents are of this plan are incorporated into the budget for the next fiscal year and when this budget plan is passed.

The total amount of the financial aid plan draft on which agreement has 77/
been reached this time is \$5,800,917,000 yen, which is an increase of
2,935,341,000 yen compared with the amount for the last fiscal year. The
details are as set forth in Attached Documents 1 and 2.


