昭和46年度の日本政府の沖縄復帰対策費に於て御説明申し上げま

1.

今國の沖縄復帰対策費は、1972年中に実現するニヒリヤーで沖縄の本土復帰に先立ち、従来の沖縄援助費と沖縄復帰対策費に改め、豊かな沖縄県づくり目標上和歌浦の整備及び沖縄県への移行等諸般の措置を円滑に行なうと共に、沖縄の経済社会の開発発展を促進すため、所要の歳政措置を講ずるニヒリヤーものであります。

その結果、明年度の日本政府の沖縄復帰対策費は、一般会計における427億円、歳政扶助費における140億円合計567億円と云ふ、昭和45年度の援助額と237億円以上上回るものが与えられたのであります。また、これに本土産米穀の完済代金の沖縄における積立金運用予定期の復元を加えますと600億円に達し、本年度の扶助額は前年度比171パーセント程度の大増加傾向を示しておられます。

次に二つ復帰対策費の中でも重要なとされる軍事問題について申し上げます。

これは、沖縄の経済対策の一環として、かつ琉球政府の行政力を強化す

また、国政事務及び県政事務における行政運営について財政措置を講ずるに

ついて市町村に対する一般財源強化のための措置を大幅に拡大いたしました。

次に、国民健康保険制度はじめ社会保険制度全般の整備充実を図るため
これに対する政策を大幅に増額いたしました。

次に、教育水準の一層の向上を図るため、前年度に引き続き小中学校及び高等
学校施設の整備を行なうとともに特に琉球大学の国立移管のため琉球大学施設
整備の充実について所要の措置を講じたものです。

次に、復帰統合事業として、
1. 本島北部、久米島、宮古島
石垣島、西表島、豊見城島の一周道路の整備、
2. 水資源開発のための調査等、
3. 琉球公園の整備費及びカーテレビスイクロ開発整備費等を計上いたしました。
また、港湾、漁港を中心とする基盤整備のための公共投資の拡大を図りました。

次に、産業経済の振興開発を促進するため、本土産木穀の壳渡し代
金の積立金の運用を図るとともに財政政策審議会を拡充しつつ、特に農
林漁業及び中小企業の振興対策について援助を強化いたしました。
