



#### 勧告第41号

- 1 沖繩にある日本国政府および沖繩県の国県有地は、1960年9月 12日付高等弁務官布令第34号(干潟の管理)および1962年4 月12日付高等弁務官指令第2号(日本国県有森林地の管理)に基 づいて琉球政府に運営を委ねられた財産を除き、琉球列島米国民政 府が管理している。
- 2 沖繩における都市区画整理事業および土地改良事業は、それぞれ 都市計画法(1953年立法第34号)又は土地改良法(1953年 立法第90号)によつて、行政主席の認可を得て施行することにな つている。 ところが、これらの事業地区に国県有地が所在する場 合、その国県有地を編入して交換分合および換地処分を行なうため の処理方式が確立されていないために、これらの事業の遂行に支障 を来している。 このため那覇市においては、美栄橋地区と第一地

区の土地区画整理事業は1962年に実質的に完了しているにもかかわらず、国県有地の都市区画整理地への編入が実現できないため、関係地主に多くの不利益を与えているとともに市民に対しても不便を与えている。

- 3 沖縄においては、都市地区の整備はもとより、都市再開発を必要とする時期にきており、また、農業生産性の向上を図るためにも、土地改良事業を推進する必要があると考えられる。 これらの事業を促進するためには、これらの事業に係る国県有地の編入がスムーズに処理されることが必要と認められる。
  - 4 したがつて、諮問委員会は、本件について、次のように措置する ことが必要と認めた。

#### Recommendation No 41

- 1. Japanese State and Okinawa Prefecture lands in Okinawa are held in custody by USCAR excluding the assets of which management rights were transferred to the GRI pursuant to High Commissioner Ordinance No. 34 of 12 September 1960, entitled: "Management of Tidelands," and High Commissioner Directive No. 2 of 12 April 1962, entitled: "Management of Prefectural and Japanese State Forest Land."
  - 2. The urban planning and land improvement programs in Okinawa are respectively executed with the approval of the Chief Executive in accordance with the Act Concerning City Planning (Act No. 34 of 1953) and the Act Concerning Land Improvement (Act No. 70 of 1953). However, in the case where state and prefecture lands are involved in the program areas, the execution of those programs is impeded since the procedures for disposition and method of incorporating those involved portions into such programs to divide, merge, and substitute the lands have not been established. Therefore, in the case of Naha City, although the urban planning programs in the Miebashi Area and the Daiichi (the first) Area were substantially completed in 1962, the failure to incorporate state and prefecture lands into urban planning areas has resulted in many disadvantages to the landowners and inconvenience to the people of the city.
    - 3. The present stage of urban planning in Okinawa requires not only development but also redevelopment of urban areas. It is also considered necessary to foster land improvement programs to improve agriculture productivity. In order to accelerate these programs it is recognized that action should be taken without delay concerning the incorporation of state and prefecture lands concerned with these projects.
    - 4. Accordingly, the AdCom recognized that it is necessary to take the following measures concerning this matter:
    - a. 日米琉諮問委員会は、本土の鈴木源吾氏より「沖繩における金融機関について」と題する琉球開発金融公社に関する報告書を受け取つた。

- この報告書は、日本の経済学者として、また、多年の経験を有する金融専門家として、内外に知られている同氏を団長とした金融調査団によつて作成されたものである。 同氏は、本諮問委員会の1968年4月9日付勧告第3号「琉球開発金融公社資産の琉球政府移管準備のための調査団派遣」に対する高等弁務官の同意に従い、本報告書作成準備に当るべく、本諮問委員会の招聘に応じたものである。

- 1. The Chairman opened the meeting and thanked the GOJ Representative for affording an opportunity for the Representatives to meet with Director Yamano of the Special Areas Liaison Bureau of the Prime Minister's Office on 24 July.
- 2. The Chairman informed the Committee that Civil Administrator Carpenter would like to visit the Committee to bid farewell to the Representatives for 15 minutes at 1530 hours on 12 August prior to his departure. The Representatives agreed to meet with the Civil Administrator in the Chairman's office.
- ${f 3.}$  As a matter of additional information, the Chairman informed the Committee that General Finn, Deputy Commanding General of U S Army Ryukyus, and General Page, Commaning General of 313th Air Division Kadena, would leave Okinawa on 28 July and on 6 August, respectively, for their new assignments in the United States, and also that Army Colonel Abrignani, who had recently left Okinawa, had suddenly died in New York of a heart attack.
- 4. Regarding the Suzuki report on the RDLC, the Chairman said that he had received three copies of the report in Japanese for the three Elements. The Chairman pointed out that it would take a long time to translate the 130 page

report and that he could not make any comments until the English translation becomes available. Therefore, the matter of how the report should be treated became the point of discussion at some length. Consequently, the Committee confirmed the following points:

- a. The letter acknowledging the receipt of the report will be drafted and dispatched by the Chairman on behalf of the Committee.
- b. The contents of the report will be treated as confidential and will not be disclosed for the time being.
- c. The matter of disclosing the receipt of the report will be further discussed.
  - d. The report itself is not a proposal.
- e. The report will be referred to the Economic Subcommittee for study and for appropriate recommendations to the Committee.
- 5. Concerning the report submitted by the Economic Subcommittee on the economic future of the Ryukyus, the oral presentation of the conclusions reached by the members was made by the U S member. The Committee concluded , that although it favors the closest possible working relations between Subcommittee members and appropriate counterparts in the GRI, as emphasized in the report, it was the opinion of the Committee that Subcommittee involvement in the preparation of the GRI long term economic plan is not feasible and also that it would not be desirable for the Advisory Committee to attempt to correct the "prevailing pessimism in government and private circles" about the future of the Okinawa economy. The Chairman emphasized that such correction should be self-generating and should stem from an objective presentation of the positive aspects of the future of the economy.
- 6. The Chairman, on behalf of the Committee, therefore urged the Subcommittee to prepare a broad economic plan that will state specific actions that should be taken and problem areas that should be analyzed. He said that the objective of the plan should be to state "where the economy should go and what steps are necessary toget it there," and that it should be completed not later than the middle of October.

- 1. The Chairman opened the meeting by informing the Committee that three U S Government officials from the Departments of State and Treasury, respectively, will arrive from Tokyo on 3 August for a three-day visit after attending the Japan-U S Trade and Economic Conference in Tokyo. The Chairman said that although he did not know their detailed schedules in Okinawa, he invited the cooperation of the other two Representatives should the officials desire to meet with the Committee.
- 2. The Chairman also informed the Committee that his Government had approved the proposal on urban planning involving state and prefectural lands in the form desired by the GOJ and GRI. The Chairman invited comments of the GOJ and GRI Representatives on whether to submit the recommendation to the High Commissioner without delay or to wait until a few other recommendations became available. The GRI Representative said that the proposal was regarded by his Government as an important item and pressed for forwarding the recommendation as soon as possible. He said it would not be necessary for the three Representatives to present the recommendation to the High Commissioner, and suggested that it be hand carried to the High Commissioner by the Chairman on behalf of the Committee. It was therefore tentatively agreed to recommend the proposal on 30 July when the Chairman meets with the High Commissioner.

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The Representatives also agreed that they would not hold a press conference for this one recommendation but that a press release would be prepared for the news media.

- 3. The GOJ Representative informed the Committee that his Government was prepared to approve the following proposals:
  - a. Complete Transfer of Management Rights of Tidelands
  - b. Adjustment and Identification of Permanent Family Register
  - c. Promotion of Exports

The Chairman remarked that, to the best of his knowledge, the necessary coordination has not yet been completed on these items.

- 4. The Subcommittee for Progress Reports informed the Committee that the translation from the Japanese of the information on the status of implementation of recommendations had been completed by the Joint Secretariat, and that the Progress Report to the High Commissioner should be completed in the very near future.
- 5. Lastly, the Chairman informed the Committee that the Japanese version of the DMJM report on industrial sites would not be available until the middle of August because of problems with the printer.

- 1. The Chairman opened the meeting by informing the Representatives that they had been extended an invitation by the High Commissioner to join him in his plane for a trip to one of the outer islands at a future date. The Chairman said he had suggested to the High Commissioner that the Committee might be most interested in visiting the island of Iriomote, where none of the Representatives has been.
- 2. The Chairman also informed the Committee that Civil Administrator Carpenter would like to visit the Committee for half an hour to pay farewell to the Representatives at 1530 hours on 11 August in the Chairman's office, instead of 12 August as it was originally scheduled, and that Mr. Fearey, the new Civil Administrator, would like to pay a courtesy call on the GOJ Representative from 1010 to 1030 hours and on the GRI Representative from 1030 to 1050 hours on Monday, 25 August. He will be accompanied by Deputy Civil Administrator Bennett.
- 3. Concerning the proposed letter to Mr. Gengo Suzuki, the Committee agreed to insert a statement to the effect that the Committee would issue a press release acknowledging receipt of the Suzuki report, and also to inclose in

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the letter a copy of the proposed press release. The GRI Representative suggested that the letter should contain an explicit statement to the effect that once a report is submitted to the Committee, the governments of (the respective elements would then have access to it. The Chairman replied he would take another look at the proposed letter to make sure this point is included.

- 4. As a matter of clarification, the Chairman mentioned that, prior to the recent Yamano visit, the press had reported that a meeting of the Japan-Ryukyu Economic Promotion Council would be held in Okinawa either in August or in September, but that the Okinawa Times had subsequently reported only the subject matter for discussion (cattle raising and tourism) and nothing about the time of a meeting. He therefore asked the GOJ Representative whether he had any knowledge as to when the reported meeting would be held. The GOJ Representative replied that no definite date had been set but that he was certain the USCAR would be advised in advance when a decision is made on the time of the meeting.
- 5. The Chairman referred to the economic proposals to be submitted by the GOJ as mentioned in the meeting of 22 July, and suggested they should be looked at in the context of the Economic Subcommittee report to the Committee due in the middle of October. Both Representatives agreed to this view. In this connection, the Chairman indicated that the Economic Subcommittee report should be developed to include a general discussion of the economy. delineation of problem areas and proposals to the Committee.
- 6. In conclusion, the GOJ Representative expressed regret on behalf of his Government for the Haneda Airport incident caused by a young Japanese on 31 July.

- 1. The Chairman opened the meeting by announcing that Civil Administrator and Mrs. Carpenter would leave from the Naha Civil Air Terminal at 1725 hours on 15 August, and that Mr. Fearey, Mr. Carpenter's successor, would arrive on 20 August. It was also announced that Mr. Finn, State Department Country Director for Japan, had arrived from Tokyo and that luncheon with him would be in the Harborview Club at 12 o'clock this date. The Chairman said that Mr. Barnett, another State Department official, would already have departed the islands before the time for the luncheon.
- 2. The Chairman reminded both Education and Social Welfare Subcommittees that reports on their respective areas are due on 12 August. He said that the Committee was looking forward to the reports.
- 3. The Chairman informed the Committee that he would take the recommendation on urban planning involving state and prefectural lands to the High Commissioner at 1430 hours this date for his approval. The GOJ Representative , said that he had received an instruction from his Government not to recommend

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it until further notice. He explained that a minor change in wording had been suggested by his Government, but he hoped that a definite attitude on this matter would be available from his Government by noon.

- 4. In order to avoid the last-minute discovery of translation errors in recommendations, the Chairman suggested that the Joint Secretariat be responsible for the distribution of the bilingual text of proposals to the persons responsible for translation in each element for their review before they are referred to appropriate subcommittees. Both GOJ and GRI Representatives agreed to the suggestion.
- 5. The Chairman expressed appreciation to the GOJ Representative for economic papers brought by Mr. Mabuchi of his Element. He said that the information would be very useful to the Economic Subcommittee. In this connection, the Chairman asked whether the English version of the survey commissioned by the GOJ on industrial sites in Okinawa, which is similar to the DMJM report on industrial sites, can be obtained. The GOJ Representative said that the report is available only in Japanese and that he has a copy in his office. He thought it would not be translated into English. The Chairman suggested that perhaps he could orally inform the other Economic Subcommittee members of the major conclusions.
- 6. Regarding the proposal on family registers, it was confirmed that the proposal is still in the category of active consideration. The Chairman said that the proposal was being considered by both USG and GRI.
- 7. The Chairman informed the Committee that the letter of appreciation to Mr. Gengo Suzuki had already been dispatched. The GOJ Representative explained that the intention of the AdCom on the RDLC survey report had been squarely conveyed to Mr. Suzuki by Mr. Mabuchi while he was in Tokyo.
