

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

- 1. The Chairman opened the meeting by confirming that Civil Administrator Carpenter would leave Okinawa at 1725 hours on 15 August, and that Mr. Fearey, who will succeed Mr. Carpenter, would arrive on 20 August.
- 2. Referring to the newspaper report about the arrival of a survey team dispatched by the Economic Planning Agency, the Chairman asked the GOJ Representative whether it would be appropriate for the Committee to meet with the survey team. The GOJ Representative replied that it would not be necessary for the Representatives to meet with the team members in view of their status. However, he said that it would be appropriate for the Economic Subcommittee to meet with the survey team and that necessary arrangements would be made by his Element for this meeting if it was agreeable to the other Representatives. Both U S and GRI Representatives agreed.
- 3. Commenting on the report submitted by the Economic Subcommittee on 8 August, the Chairman said that the Committee generally agreed with it

in principle and that the Subcommittee could proceed with its task on the basis of this understanding. However, he made specific comments on items 7 and 8 of the report.

- . Concerning the matter of Economic Subcommittee representation in relevant seminars, conferences, etc., in Tokyo (Item 7), the Chairman said that the Committee might have to say "no" depending upon the situation at the time. Concerning the matter of a suggested field trip to Taiwan (Item 8), the Chairman said the Committee would have no objection in principle. However, the Subcommittee was requested to be more precise in formulating the objective of the proposed trip. The Chairman added that the GOJ Representative had stated he would have to discuss with his Government the GOJ participation in the proposed trip.
- 5. In compliance with the Committee's request, the Education Subcommittee presented a list of 8 items dealing with education which should be taken up by the Committee for future consideration. In presenting the list, Mr. Shimada explained that although the first two items on FM radio and scholarship programs were being drafted by the GOJ side, he thought that it would require further coordination with Tokyo. The Subcommittee also stated that it would not be feasible to act on three of the items prior to reversion. In response to a question raised by the Chairman, Mr. Shimada replied that it would take about six more months before all of the other five items could be tabled.
- 6. The Social Welfare Subcommittee also presented its report on 6 items in the social welfare field. Mr. Walters, representing the Subcommittee, said that the items are significant for ittaika but that it would take about six months to move the proposals to the recommendation stage, during which time additional items might arise.
- 7. The Chairman expressed appreciation to the members of the Education and Social Welfare Subcommittees for their work in consolidating the items to be considered in the future. He said that the lists gave the Committee a much clearer concept of what remained to be done to achieve ittaika in these fields.

- 1. The Chairman opened the meeting by informing the Committee of the receipt of a letter from the Airport Operators Committee (AOC) concerning the abolition of passport inspection for transit passengers at the Naha Airport. The Chairman suggested that the Secretariat prepare a standard reply acknowledging receipt of the letter. The other two Representatives agreed, but the GOJ Representative said that his Government was interested in the proposal contoined in the letter and suggested that the matter be given more formal consideration by the Committee. The Chairman stated he was not familiar with the practices involved and said that he would have to inform himself in greater detail.
- 2. In response to a question of the Chairman concerning the suggested meeting between the Economic Subcommittee and the survey team from the Economic Planning Agency prior to its return to Tokyo on 16 August, the GOJ Representative replied that the tight schedule of the survey team would not seem to allow it to meet with the members of the Subcommittee. However, he said the Subcommittee members could meet with the team on the afternoon of

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the day the leader was scheduled to give a lecture in Naha. The Subcommittee members thus agreed to attend the lecture.

- 3. Referring to the reports presented in the previous meeting by the Education and Social Welfare Subcommittees, the Chairman said the Committee would look forward to receiving the draft proposals during the next six months on items listed in the reports.
- 4. The Chairman informed the members of the Economic Subcommittee that they could submit their study on the Suzuki report any time before 26 August, which is the due date originally set by the Committee.
- 5. The GRI Representative suggested that the Economic Subcommittee study and list the items which are necessary for ittaika in the economic field, in addition to the work which the Subcommittee is now pursuing. The other Representatives agreed.
- 6. After completing its regular business, the Committee met with Director Tonaki of the Okinawa Tourism Development Corporation (OTDC). This meeting was arranged by the GRI Representative to afford an opportunity for the Committee to hear the tourism development programs of the OTDC. For the presentation of his briefing, Mr. Tonaki exhibited statistical charts, photographs, and sketches of the areas to be developed for tourist attraction. In conclusion of this briefing, Mr. Tonaki expressed appreciation for having the opportunity to brief the Committee and requested its cooperation to support the OTDC programs. In response to the request of the GOJ Representative, Mr. Tonaki replied that he would furnish the Committee with copies of the statistical charts which he used for this briefing.
- 7. Lastly, the Chairman thanked Mr. Tonaki for his presentation of OTDC programs on behalf of the Committee.
