Subjects to be Referred to General Administrative Subcommittee for Development of Proposals to be Considered by the Advisory Committee

1. Improvement of River Management (GRI)
2. Integration of Laws on Expropriation and Urban Planning (GOJ)
3. Establishment of the Land Readjustment Law (GOJ)
4. Enhancement of Shi-Cho-Son Administrative and Financial Standards (GOJ)
5. Complete Transfer of Management Rights of Tidelands (GRI)
6. Transfer of Assets Owned by State and Prefectural Government (GRI)
7. Protection of Seamen (in foreign lands) (GOJ)
8. Redistribution of State, Prefectural, and Shi-Cho-Son Functions (GRI)
9. Establishment of "Privately Owned" Post Offices (GRI)
10. Promotion of Shi-Cho-Son Consolidation (GRI)
11. Identification of Financial and Accounting Systems of GRI (GRI)
12. Identification of Administrative and Financial Systems of Shi-Cho-Son (GRI)

It is suggested that the Administrative Subcommittee arrange their suggestions in the order of importance and then proceed to give the Committee appropriate proposals for action on them. At a later date, perhaps at the time of the proposed Sato/Nixon meeting, it would be desirable if the subcommittee could provide the Committee with an estimate of the time required to carry these proposals through the recommendation stage.

Education Subcommittee. Because of the very great amount of work already done by this Subcommittee on the proposal for "Adjustment and Identification of Permanent Family Register," (GRI) it is recommended that no change be made in this assignment. Identification of Qualifications and Licenses (GRI) might also remain with this subcommittee. That portion of Identification of Public Corporations and other Government sponsored organizations (GRI) that deals with such non-economic matters as Scholarship Association, War Bereaved Family Association, etc., should be the responsibility of the Education Committee.

Social Welfare. It is suggested that the following suggestions be referred to the Social Welfare Subcommittee: Annuity Benefits for Those Who Have Been Continuously Employed Since Before the War (GRI); Transfer of the Status of Government Employees (GRI).

Economic. The following suggestions would then logically fall to the Economic Subcommittee:

- a. Identification of the National Tax Systems (GOJ)
- b. Establishment of the Road System and Promotion of Its Improvement (GOJ)
- c. Transfer of Public Monopoly Business (Tobacco, salt, etc.) (GRI)
- d. Omission of a Pilot Boat for Regular Lines (GOJ)
- e. Improvement of the Coastguard System (GOJ)
- f. Preparation for Change from the Right Traffic to the Left (GRI)
- g. Identification of Handling High Pressure Gas (GRI)
- h. Improvement of Handling Explosives (GRI)
- i. Strengthening and Identification of Meteorological Activities (GRI)
- j. Identification of Economic and Financial Public Corporations (GRI)
(Not to include Scholarship Association, War Bereaved Family Association, etc.)

All subcommittee assignments would remain subject to possible change at a later date, as decided by the Committee, to assure equitable distribution of workload to the extent possible and maximum efficient utilization of resources.

1. The Chairman opened the meeting and suggested that a letter of appreciation be sent to Mr. Tonaki, the Director of the Okinawa Tourism Development Corporation (OTDC), for the presentation of his briefing on the OTDC programs. Both GOJ and GRI Representatives agreed to the suggestion and asked the Chairman to draft the letter.

2. The Chairman provided each Representative with a copy of the Japanese version of the DMJM industrial sites survey report, which had been desired for a long time. He informed the GOJ and the GRI Representatives that 23 additional copies were available and that they could be obtained through Mr. Billingsley of his Element.

3. Concerning slight changes in the arrival time of Mr. Fearey and his courtesy call on the Committee, the Chairman said the new schedule of Mr. Fearey's arrival is at 1032 hours at the Naha Airport on 20 August and

that his courtesy calls on the GOJ Representative would be from 1025 to 1045 hours and on the GRI Representative from 1045 to 1105 hours on 25 August. The Chairman added that he would send a note to each Representative to confirm the schedules.

4. Reminding the Subcommittee for Progress Reports about the preparation of its first 1969 report to the High Commissioner, the Chairman requested it to expedite the report so there would not be an overlap with the second report due in October.

5. Referring to the newspaper article about the dispatch of a GOJ group to Okinawa to study the future role of the AdCom, the Chairman suggested the Committee should meet with the group in the light of its mission. However, the GOJ Representative said the purpose of the reported study group had not been confirmed, and that it would not be necessary for the Committee to meet with the group. The GOJ Representative explained to the Committee that the Special Areas Liaison Bureau (SALB) of the Prime Minister's Office is studying the role of various related organizations and that the reported mission of the group would seem to be just one of the SALB study projects.

6. The Chairman then touched on the establishment of a new subcommittee called the "General Administrative Affairs Subcommittee," as suggested by the GRI Representative, to study those items which do not fall within the scope of the other existing subcommittees, including those on state and prefectural lands. The Committee felt that such a subcommittee is necessary and therefore agreed to establish it. The U S Representative designated Mr. Billingsley as the U S member on the subcommittee and stated that, by Friday, he would suggest the logical arrangements for placing in appropriate subcommittees the new items listed by the prospective members of the new subcommittee. In this connection, the Chairman referred to the suggestion which the GRI Representative had previously made concerning the submission of proposals through informal discussions within the subcommittees and said that such practice has now generated many suggestions.

1. The Chairman opened the meeting by informing the Committee that Civil Administrator Fearey arrived on 21 August. The new Civil Administrator was originally scheduled to arrive on the 20th but this schedule was changed because of Typhoon Cora. The Chairman said that there is no change in Mr. Fearey's schedule to make courtesy calls on the GOJ and the GRI Representatives on the 25th.

2. Regarding the list of 5 tabled proposals and 21 new suggestions for proposals submitted by what is now called the "General Administrative Subcommittee," the Chairman furnished each Representative with a copy of the rearranged list of the proposals and suggestions divided by various fields of subcommittees. He explained that the flexible rearrangement of the listed items was made in consideration of the workload of each subcommittee. As a result of discussion on the list, it was agreed to defer the final action until the following meeting on Tuesday.

3. In response to the reference made by the Chairman on the dispatch of a survey team to Okinawa by the Special Areas Liaison Bureau of the Prime Minister's Office mentioned in the last meeting, the GOJ Representative replied that the dispatch of the team had been delayed.

4. The GRI Representative referred to one of the Committee meetings last year (3 September 1968) in which he raised the matter of simplification of immigration procedures for Japanese nationals traveling between Japan proper and Okinawa. He is of the opinion that such procedures should be limited for exit only and not for entry in view of the large number of visitors, and also mentioned the problems being created by students and others protesting the regulations. The Chairman said he was not aware of the matter but that he would look into the minutes to acquaint himself with the nature of the problem. The GRI Representative subsequently submitted an informal draft recommendation (10 September 1968) on this subject.
