Dear Sir,

We are writing to ask for your kind assistance to us in our production of a series of radio and television documentary programs concerning national security, as per the coverage plan enclosed herewith.

In order to make on-the-spot coverage for this series, we are sending a three-man reporting team, consisting of reporter Yoshiki Hidaka and a producer and a cameraman, to various countries including the United States.

It is in the coverage in your country as proposed in the attached Plan that we need your kind assistance. For your information, our coverage plan for the United States has already been submitted, as per the enclosed copy, to your Government through the kindness of Colonel Audic, Chief of News Division of the U.S. Armed Forces in Japan.

We, therefore, should be deeply grateful if you would kindly make arrangements to enable our coverage in line with the schedule as proposed below. By the way, we wish to add that Mr. Hidaka, the leader of the reporting team, visited your country in March 1968 as a member of East Asia Pacific Journalist Tour, at the joint invitation of the Department of State and Defence, and that, on that occasion, he was given the opportunity, with the assistance of Mr. Wagner of your Division, of interviewing exclusively Dr. Kuiperin, former Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defence, and also of covering a number of military bases there.

Schedule (proposed by us)

Oct. 5th Ar. Los Angeles, Calif. Go straight to the SAC base in Riverside. An overnight stay in Riverside base. Wish to cover the take-offs of B-52s until the evening of 6th.

6th Ar. Rand Corporation, Santa Monica, in the evening. Expecting to cover the Rand Corp. on 7th. (Although we have already written to Rand, we would appreciate your confirming our request with them)

7th Ar. Technical Santa Cruz Calif.

10th Ar. Moffett Park, Sausalito, Calif. SAC. Hq.

12th Ar. Washington

13th-14th: Interview with Mr. Howard, and following to Mr. Packard's office.

"Security of the World"

1. Aim of the program

The year 1970 is the time when Japan must make her decision on the methods whereby to maintain the national security.

In the hope of providing the Japanese people with material that will help them in making this crucial decision, we should like to produce a series of programs based on the results of our on-the-spot coverage to report what kind of international conditions each country of the world envisages for the future and how each of those nations, in order to cope with future developments, considers the national defence and what type of security system she is trying to adopt.

2. Outline of the programs to be produced

The following six programs will be produced:

(1) "Theory of Deterrent - The American World-Strategy"

The United States, who believes in the achievement of world peace by means of deterrent power, is constantly under pressure of need to expand her arms in accordance with the changing world situation and the ever-advancing technology.

In this program, we wish to explore the trend of such world-strategy of the United States. The subjects of coverage we have in mind include the introduction of the organizational structure of the U.S. Department of Defence and that of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, interviews with the responsible senior officials, and the on-the-spot coverage of the anti air-attack system as seen in Greenland (Thule) and Alaska (Almendolf) as well as the coverage of the watch flights of the B52, the Vandenburg missile base and the Polaris bases.

(2) "Collective Defence of West Europe - the facts about the NATO forces"

The NATO Forces were organized, when the cold war was at its height, as a "shield" for West Europe with the American nuclear power as the "spear".



However, they have undergone substantial changes as a result of the easing of the international tension and the secession of France.

In this program, we should like to introduce the actual condition of the NATO Forces which are sometimes dubbed 'Phantom Allies'. The proposed subjects of coverage are the national defence forces of West Germany, the West German forces stationed in Denmark, the nuclear power of Britain, the national defence system of France, etc.

(3) "Security in Neutral Nations - Scandinavian countries and Switzerland"

This program will introduce the existing situation in the neutral countries which do not join either of the military alliances of the East or West but are trying to achieve stability in national security on their own. The proposed subjects of coverage are the group of underground bases of Sweden, the arms and military industries she has been independently developing, the national defence forces of Finland using the Soviet-made equipment, the training of recruited soldiers in Switzerland and her concept of national defence, etc.

(4) "The American Umbrella"

The nations under the American umbrella, that is, the nations that are woven into the strategic system of the United States, accept the stationing of American forces in their territories, sharing interests with the United States.

In this program, we wish to show in what way those nations are trying to maintain national security with the assistance of the United States. The proposed subjects of coverage are the Turkish Army that has half a million ground forces, and the Spanish forces.

(5) "New Strategic System of the Soviet Sphere - Situation behind the easing tension"

What are the aims of the Soviet Union which has been strengthening its naval power and increasing the marine corps and parachute troops?

At least, from the point of view of its strategy toward the United States, it appears that the Soviet is adopting what may be called 'flexible reaction strategy', by casting away its tense attitude of the past. If this is the case, what kind of change will be brought to the role of the Warsaw Pact Forces that were formed as against the NATO Forces? Furthermore, what course would the Soviet strategy take toward Communist China when the tension is mounting between the two countries?

Taking up such subjects as mentioned above, we should like to bring out in relief the military profiles of the "Giant of the East".

(6) "United Nations Forces as they should be and as they actually are"

The United Nations Forces, which were organized as the international police forces to maintain world peace, now appear to have become something quite different from what they ought be. However, despite such situation, the U.N. Forces are quietly continuing their steady efforts in Cyprus and the Middle East to bring about peace in those regions. Thus the U.N. Forces change their status in accordance with the role played by the United Nations in international politics.

In this program, we are expecting to appeal to our audience the ideals of the United Nations Forces through portrayal of their actual condition.

The proposed subjects of coverage are the U.N. Forces Training Center in Canada, the activities of the U.N. Forces in Cyprus and the Middle East, the meetings of the Disarmament Committee in Geneva, etc.

3. Countries to be visited for coverage

U.S.A., Greenland, Finland, Sweden, Denmark, West Germany, France, Britain, Spain, Turkey, Pakistan, Canada, Belgium, Soviet Union, East Germany and Poland.

4. Period of Coverage

Eighty (80) days, starting on October 1, 1969

5. Broadcasting schedule

February - March, 1970
