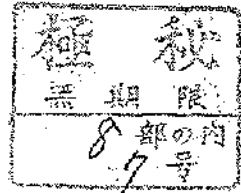

（ヴェトナム関係総論発言一節）

「将来の仮定の問題ではあるが、米國政府としては、ヴェトナム戦争が不幸にして万一長びくようなことがある場合に沖縄の施設を返還することがヴェトナムにおける米國の軍事的努力に影響を及ぼすことなきかを懸念しており、したがって、私は、万一返還予定時期に至るもなおヴェトナムにおける敵対行動が終熄をみるに至っていない場合には、政府としては、米國の軍事的努力と返還との関係を日米兩國の相互の長期的利益に合致するよういかに調整すべきかにつき、米國政府と協議を行なうべきであるかと考えるものであります。」

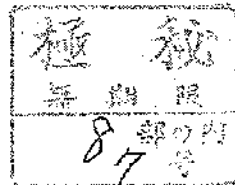

The following remarks will be made on Vietnam in the Prime Minister's Statement:-

Although it is a hypothetical question related to the future, the U.S. Government is concerned with possible effects the reversion of Okinawa might have on the U.S. military efforts in Vietnam in case the war in Vietnam would unfortunately be prolonged. I, therefore, believe that, should hostilities have not been concluded by the time reversion is scheduled to take place, our Government should hold consultations with the U.S. Government on how to achieve necessary adjustments between the U.S. military efforts and the reversion, in a manner consistent with the mutual long-term interest of the two countries.

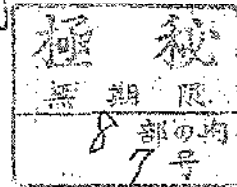

..... The President described the earnest efforts made by the United States for a peaceful and just settlement of the Vietnam problem. The Prime Minister and the President expressed their earnest hope that such a settlement be arrived at before the reversion of Okinawa. The Prime Minister further stated that Japan on her part was exploring what role she could play in bringing about stability and reconstruction in the Indo-China area.

(Communique)

7. The Prime Minister described in detail the particular sentiment of the Japanese people against nuclear weapons and the policy of the Japanese Government reflecting such sentiment. The President expressed his understanding of the position of the Japanese Government and assured the Prime Minister of the intention of the U.S. Government to ensure, without prejudice to its position with respect to the prior consultation system under the Treaty of Mutual Cooperation and Security, the reversion of Okinawa to be carried out in a manner consistent with the policy of the Japanese Government as described by the Prime Minister.
